**Berth 301 Port of Los Angeles**



Standard Industries was able to recycle or reuse 98.78% of the onsite materials from Berth 301 in the Port of Los Angeles. They were able to conserve over 1.7 million gallons of water in water-scarce LA while using over 40,000 cy of coal and petroleum coke impacted soil as cover at a local landfill. They recycled over 700 rail ties, over 10,000 tons of metal and salvaged Berth 301's coal and coke transporting conveyor system for reuse in the Midwest. Berth 301's coal rail car dumper was disassembled and moved to Australia for reuse there. All of the transformers, electrical switchgear, breakers, and lights were salvaged and reused by the U.S. Navy and Standard Industries extracted 320 steel piles, some 75-foot in length, for use as falsework in bridge construction. They also recycled over 150,000 tons of concrete and asphalt for use as base material for new roads and as foundation support.
